


































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### NOTICE

### 7. 3rd MONI BANERJEE MEMORIAL LECTURE:

Above was organized at 3.00 pm. on Saturday the 15th March'2014 at the auditorium of Jagadis Bose National Science Talent Search, 1300 Rajdanga Main Road, Kasba, Kolkata-700 107.

The programme commenced with garlanding the portrait of Late Prof. Moni Banerjee by a Senior Member of ILTA, daughter of Late Prof. Banerjee, Representatives of GCELT/ CFTC, the recipients of Moni Banerjee Memorial Medal.

This was followed by welcome address of Mr. Arnab Jha, President ILTA who touched upon the life



and achievements of Late Prof. Moni Banerjee, the founder Secretary of ILTA. Mr. Susanta Mallick, General Secretary, ILTA then announced the names of the recipients of Moni Banerjee Memorial Medal who received the same from President ILTA and Mr. Tapan Chattopadhyay, Regional Director, CLE (ER):

### 8. IULTCS CONGRESS 2017:

IULTCS Congress in 1999 was for the first time held in an Asian country - India. The Congress of



2017 is going to be held in India again jointly organized by ILTA & CSIR-CLRI. Dr. K. J. Sreeram, Scientist, CSIR-CLRI and Vice-President (SR) ILTA has been appointed Coordinator from CLRI's side. He attended the Istanbul Congress in May end 2013 and publicized 2017 IULTCS Congress in India.

### 9. PROGRAMME FOR IMPLEMENTING EMERGING & SUSTAINABLE TECHNOLOGIES (PrIEST):

A programme titled as above and consisting of a series of lectures/demonstrations for implementing newer and cleaner technologies in leather and leather goods industry in West Bengal region had been undertaken by ILTA and CSIR-CLRI in association with CLCTA and ILPA.

There were 2/3 demonstrations and 11 lectures during the period April' 2012 to July' 2013. During Aug 2013 to Feb 2014 Five more lectures were delivered as detailed below:

### a) 12th Lecture on 31.08.2013:

"Secondary Biological Ttreatment of Tannery Waste Water" by Dr. S. V. Srinivasan, Scientist, Environmental Technology Division, CSIR-CLRI, Chennai. There were 60 participants and the Question – Answer session was most interesting.

### b) 13<sup>th</sup> Lecture on 21.09.2013:

"System development for Leather Industry/processing unit Chemical Industry Software" – Demonstration" by S. N. Vasagam, Scientist, Economics Research Division, CSIR – CLRI, Chennai. The lecture was originally scheduled for 26.10.2013 but had to be advanced at a short notice for reasons beyond our control. This resulted in number of participants being a little lower than usual.

### c) 14th Lecture on 28.11.2013:

"Innovations for Tanning Industry" by Dr. D. Lakshmanan, MSMIE, Ph.D., Former Scientist Tannery Division, CSIR – CLRI, Chennai. There were 58 participants.

### d) 15th Lecture on 16.01.2014:

"Odour Control for Tanneries" by Dr. R.C.Panda, M.Tech, Ph.D (Chem. Engg. IIT Madras). Principal Scientist, Chemical Engg. Division, CSIR – CLRI, Chennai. The lecture was elaborated with a film taken on the system installed at S.A.A. Tannery, Erode and was most informa-



tive and interesting as reflected by a host of questions during the Q & A session.

### e) 16th Lecture on 27.02.2014:

"Global Raw Material Availability and Emerging Opportunities" by Dr. Giriyappa Kollannavar, MBA, MSc, PhD, Principal Technical Officer, Head Economic Research Division, CSIR – CLRI, Chennai. There were 59 participants.

All the lectures and demonstrations were organized in an auditorium inside the Kolkata Leather Complex resulting in a large participation of the tanners.

The programme is expected to go a long way in improving the environment in Kolkata Leather Complex leading to a positive change in the perception of general public about the leather industry. Feedbacks were collected, work was done on feedback received and necessary follow-up measures were taken.

### 10. LEXPO - DURGAPUR - IV:

LEXPO-DURGAPUR-IV could not be organized due to non-availability of ground at a suitable time.

### 11. LEXPO-SILIGURI-XX:

The Inaugural ceremony took place on Friday the 21st Feb' 2014 afternoon at the Kanchanjungha Krirangan adjacent ground. Mrs. Gangotri Dutta, Mayor, Siliguri Municipal Corporation who was to inaugurate the fair got tied up in the Board Meeting of the Corporation and finally regretted her inability to attend. This resulted in delay in commencement of the ceremony.

A large number of representatives from newspapers were present and the Secretary of the Journalists' Association, Mr. Angshuman kindly consented to inaugurate the fair. Mr. Jiban Dasgupta, Jt. Secretary, ILTA welcomed all present regretting the delay in commencing the programme. He elaborated that the best time for organizing LEXPO at Siliguri is December/January. For the past several years we are allocated ground initially around that time but subsequently changed to February/March. This affects adversely the small and tiny sector leather units whose products are exhibited/sold through LEXPOs. Mr. Dasgupta appealed to the competent authority to help the small and tiny sector leather units by allocating the ground in December/January. Mr. Dasgupta then invited the Chief Guest to deliver his Inaugural Address and inaugurate the fair.

Mr. Sudhanshu Kr. Biswas, Convener, LEXPO Siliguri - XX then offered a Vote of Thanks for help and cooperation received from all concerned in organizing LEXPO Siliguri - XX after pointing out that late starting of the fair was the reason for only 42 nos. of stall at the fair compared to earlier



around 60 nos.

### 12. LEXPO -KOLKATA- XXXVIII:

A brief inaugural ceremony of 38th LEXPO at Kolkata was organized at the Geetanjali Stadium, Sector-B, Rajdanga Main Road, Kasba, Kolkata-700 107.

After Mr. Arnab Jha, the President, ILTA introduced Mr. Siddhartha Guha who first conceived the idea of LEXPO in ILTA and Mr. Sambhu Das Set who has been the publisher of JILTA for over the past three decades, Mr. Jha requested Mr. Guha to address the gathering Mr. Guha in his address recaptured the early days of LEXPO which used to be organized as buyer-seller meet in Star Hotels from 1977 to 1981 before moving to Maidan in 1982.

The Inaugural lamp was then lit by Mr. Sambhu Das Set, Mr. Siddhartha Guha and Mr. Arnab Jha and the fair was declared open. Mr. Shiladitya Deb Choudhury, Jt. Secretary, ILTA offered the Vote of Thanks in absence of Mr. Susanta Mallick, General Secretary, ILTA, as he was out of country. The fair continued till  $14^{\rm th}$  April, 2014 remaining open from 2.00 pm to 8.00 pm everyday. There were 24 stalls in the fair.

### 13. Seminar organized by ILTA at IILF-2014 at Chennai

A seminar was organized by Indian Leather Technologists Association (ILTA) in collaboration with 'GCELT', 'CSIR-CLRI' and 'Indian Leather' at the Hall-A of Convention Center in the Chennai Trade Center campus on  $2^{nd}$  February' 2014 during  $29^{th}$  India International Leather Fair (IILF-2014).

It was the 'first' outreach endeavour of ILTA on the occasion of India International Leather Fair 2014, at Chennai and was a grand venture in reaching out the endeavours of "Leather Technologists" to the Members of the Indian Leather Fraternity.

Dignitaries on the dais were Mr. Susanta Mallick, General Secretary, ILTA, Mr. Arnab Jha, President, ILTA, Dr. Buddhadeb Chattopadhyay, Principal, GCELT, Kolkata and a speaker of the day, Dr. Roberto Vego, Consultant, ASSOMAC, UNIDO, the Chief Guest of the programme, Dr. A. B. Mandal, Director, CSIR - CLRI, Chennai, another speaker of the day, Mr. S. S. Kumar, Chairman, GB, GCELT, the Guest of Honour of the programme and Dr. J. Raghava Rao, Secretary, Southern Regional Committee, ILTA. A good audience consisting of around 60 participants were there in the 75-80 persons capacity hall.

The programme commenced with Welcome Address by Mr Arnab Jha highlighting the Mission & Vision and principal objectives of ILTA. He also explained about the relationship of ILTA with IULTCS and intimated the gathering about the forthcoming IULTCS congress to be held



at India in 2017.

Mr. Susanta Mallick, in his address, explained the objectives of this Seminar and expressed his hope to conduct more seminars countrywide to share the recent R & D activities and technological developments. He also explained in brief, the role of ILTA in Indian Leather Industry.

wear Science & Engineering) examination of Anna University in 2014 and was awarded B.M.Das Memorial Medal on  $64^{\rm th}$  Foundation Day.

### 15. FINANCIAL POSITION:

### 15.1 LEXPO SILIGURI - XX

Excess of income over expenditure was Rs. 2,60,728.74 against Rs. 6,86,929.00 last year.

### 15.2. INCOME OF ILTA

Above taken along with other revenues earned, the total excess of income over expenditure of ILTA stood at 24,89,262.78 against Rs. 37,81,791.62 last year.

### 15.3. WELFARE FUND

An amount of Rs. 1,00,000.00 has been transferred and disbursement during the year was Rs. 71,508.00 bringing the total to Rs. 14,70,560.00.

### 15.4. B. M. DAS MEMORIAL FUND

An amount of Rs. 2,00,000.00 has been transferred and disbursement during the year was Rs. 30,064.00 bringing the total to Rs. 9,95,929.00.

### 15.5. PUBLICATION OF JOURNAL & BOOKS FUND

An amount of Rs. 6,20,000.00 has been transferred and disbursement during the year was Rs. 4,06,098.00 bringing the total to Rs. 15,75,739.20.

### 15.6. BUILDING FUND

After allowing depreciation of Rs. 3,27,627.35 and transfer of Rs. 6,00,000.00 the fund stands at Rs. 1,29,27,478.93 against Rs. 1,26,55,106.28 last year.

### 15.7. SANJOY SEN MEMORIAL FUND

### A. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

### i) Basis of Preparation of Financial Statements

The Financial Statements are prepared on accrual basis under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Accounting Standards notified under the Companies (Accounting Standards) Rules, 2006 pursuant to section 211 (3C) of the Companies Act, 1956. The Association follows the accrual basis of accounting in respect of its Income and Expenditure except for Subscription, Decoration expenses, Publicity expenses, Security charges and Retirement Benefits, which are accounted for on cash basis.

### ii) Use of Estimates

In preparing the Financial Statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in India, Management is required to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and the disclosure of contingent liabilities as at the date of the Financial Statements and the amounts of revenue and expenses during the reported period. Actual results could differ from those estimates. Any revision to such estimates is recognised in the period the same is determined.

### iii) Prior Period Adjustments, Exceptional Items, Extraordinary Items and Changes in Accounting Policies

Prior period adjustments, exceptional items, extraordinary items and changes in accounting policies having material impact on the financial affairs of the association are disclosed.

### iv) Fixed Assets

Fixed Assets are stated at historical cost, which is inclusive of taxes, duties, freight and other incidental expenses related to the acquisition and installation of such assets.

### v) Depreciation

Depreciation is provided on 'Written Down Value (WDV) Method' at the rates as prescribed in Schedule-XIV of the Companies Act, 1956 read with the notification dated 16.12.1993. Leasehold land is amortized over the lease period. Depreciation on Building is adjusted against amount accumulated under the 'Building fund'.

### vi) Valuation of Inventory

Stocks of books are valued at lower of cost or net realizable value and cost is ascertained under FIFO Method.



### vii) Investments

Investments held by the Association which are long term in nature are stated at cost unless there is a permanent diminution in value where provision for diminution is made on individual investment basis. Current investments are valued at cost or market price or fair value, whichever is lower. Earnings on investments are accounted for on accrual basis.

### viii) Transactions in Foreign Currencies

Payments made in foreign currencies are converted at the exchange rates prevailing on the day of remittance.

### ix) Provisions, contingent liabilities and contingent assets.

A provision is made based on a reliable estimate when it is probable that an outflow of resources embodying economic benefits will be required to settle an obligation.

Contingent liabilities if material are disclosed by way of Notes to Accounts. Contingent assets are not recognized or disclosed in the financial statement.

### **B. NOTES TO ACCOUNTS**

- 1) The Association provides various services to its members and conducts several social and economic activities which include assisting and encouraging of the application of scientific methods of manufacturing and utilization of leather and allied products, publication of journals and other literature on the subject, holding meetings/seminars and organizing exhibitions of leather products for the purpose of development of the leather industry etc. Amounts realized from such activities are used for furtherance of the objectives of the Association. The association is of the view that such realizations are not in the nature of activities that are subject to service tax such as stall rent, sponsorship, subscriptions etc, as such services are predominantly provided to the Members either on the ground of "mutuality of interest" or are of a public service of charitable nature.
- 2) Contingent liability not provided in the accounts in respect of claims against the Association not acknowledged as debt, in respect of Ground rent received for holding Lexpo-2006 at Milan Mela ground pending settlement of appeal for complete waiver of the said rent less rebate amounting to Rs 10,00,000/- (previous year Rs 10,00,000/-).

A demand of Rs. 8,81,960 for the financial year 2009-10 has been raised by the Income Tax Authorities against which the Association has filed an appeal before the first Appellate Authority on  $7^{th}$  May, 2013. Out of this amount a token payment of Rs 50,000 has been paid on  $29^{th}$  June, 2013 as per verbal instructions of Income tax authorities Therefore, the balance of Rs 831,960 is a contingent liability not provided in the accounts in respect of claims against the Association not acknowledged as debt.

3) Depreciation amounting to Rs. 3,27,627.35 (Previous Year Rs. 3,39,810.63) on Building (created out of Building Fund) is adjusted against amount released from Building Fund.



- 4) Year end balance confirmation certificates from Sundry Debtors, Loans & Advances, Deposits & Sundry Creditors are awaited and therefore could not be produced to auditors for verification.
  - Furthermore, in the opinion of the management, all current assets, loans & advances would be realized at the values at which these are stated in the accounts.
- 5) Sundry creditors include Rs 4,000 (2007-08) and Rs 15,195 (2008-09). The same is under the consideration of the management for necessary future action
- 6) Year end confirmation certificate of balance with Bank of India, (Ranchi branch) amounting to Rs.1,092/-, SBI (Chennai branch) amounting to Rs.10,347/- and United Bank of India(Lalbazar Branch) amounting to Rs.30,669 have not been obtained and could not be produced to auditors for verification.
- 7) TDS Certificates of Rs 6,000/- have not been obtained and could not be produced to the Auditors for verification.
- 8) The Association is registered under Section 12A of the Income-tax Act, 1961 and hence claims deduction under Section 11 of the said Act. Consequently the Association is not liable to pay income tax dues on its surplus in terms of the related provisions of the said Act.
- 9) Additional information given in pursuance of the requirement of Part II of Revised Schedule VI to the Companies Act, 1956.
